CSP ANNUAL FUNDRAISER for CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL OF COLORADO

Our homeschool community is invited to participate in the TCA K-12 fundraising effort to collect donations for the Children's Hospital of Colorado, set to open in Colorado Springs in the spring of 2019. The nearly 300,000 square foot facility will have 110 beds and will feature the only pediatric emergency department in the region. Children and their families across southern Colorado and neighboring states will have access to the expert pediatric care of a TOP 10 children's hospital, close to home. With this new facility, Children's Colorado team members can care for every child regardless of their family's ability to pay. Every single dollar counts!

CSP CURRICULUM

CSP integrates Classical Elements into our weekly K-8 curriculum even though the course is no longer one of CSP's Specials. During the first quarter, several teachers focused on the first line of the Titan's Creed: "**Titans endeavor to recognize and pursue truth, beauty, and goodness.**" In upper elementary grades, students may view an inspirational video that demonstrates the weekly creed/character focus, followed by a discussion, at times including an engaging Socratic Seminar, and relating definitions and life applications to the day's literature and classical elements' focus. Students in lower elementary grades are taught the meaning of select idioms and memorize and recite poems and/or historical document excerpts. Classical Elements was designed to include a strong character component.

GRAMMAR BASICS FOR HOMESCHOOLERS

We ask parents to help students include these Grammar basics on every written assignment.

It's important that students master and apply these foundational skills from Gr. 1 - 8.

- Begin sentences with a capital letter.
- Use correct punctuation including end marks.
- Proper capitalization of names, cities, states, proper nouns
- Correct use of apostrophes to show possession
- Complete sentences – no fragments
- Does the sentence have a subject and verb?
- The complete sentence should make sense.
- Legible handwriting
- Correct Spelling
