Some of you are discerning whether **College Pathways (CP) or CSP enrollment** would be best for your child **after 6th grade**. (CP is only for Gr. 7 – 12.) You are invited to attend the annual **CSP-CP Prospective Parent Meeting**. (This meeting is held each year.) The distinctives of each non-traditional program will be explained. There will be faculty from both programs and a panel of CP students/parents available to answer your questions. The Registrar offers 2019-20 seats to currently enrolled CSP students in February, so it's a good idea for parents to be informed of their choices. Also, check out the CP website. There is a **CP Readiness Tool** that is quite helpful in discerning whether your child will be ready for the rigor of CP.

****Requesting a 2019-20 CP class schedule:** Within the CP OFFER form sent to JH parents will be a template to plan a schedule. You'll then pick and choose classes that are listed in the class request form. Schedules are confirmed by CP on a first come, first served basis, so the sooner you respond to your offer email, the better your child's chances are of getting the classes he/she wants.

* **Mid to Late April** – NEW CSP Gr. 7 & 8 students

CSP ANNUAL FUNDRAISER for CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL OF COLORADO

TESTING/EVALUATION OPTIONS FOR HOMESCHOOLERS

Gr. 3, 5, & 7 only

Per Colorado law, homeschool students in the odd grades, beginning in Gr. 3, are required to take a standardized test or have a formal evaluation submitted to your local school district. (D20 recognizes CSP as the depository for these test scores or formal evaluation summary.) CSP offers the ITBS-Cog AT Survey Battery in Grades 3, 5, and 7 for a **\$25 fee**. Test dates are:

- **Fri. March 8** for WED classes Gr. 3 & 5 and MON. Gr. 7
- **Fri. March 15** for TH classes Gr 3 & 5
- Only students currently enrolled in CSP may test with us.
- A CSP Testing Information document including a permission slip will be sent home in January.
- Practice test booklets will be available on January 14.
- We will send home a copy of the student's test scores in April and file the scores in his/her cum file at CSP.
- If you cannot test with CSP, feel free to test elsewhere or hire a qualified evaluator to come into your home, evaluate your child's work samples, and write a summary of his/her yearly progress. Provide CSP with a copy of the test scores or written evaluation summary to place in your child's cum file. (You do not need to file test results or the summary with D20 also.)

CSP POLICY

PM CARPOOL – SIBLING PICK UP

CP students are NOT allowed in the Elementary wing, for safety sake. This has been TCA's policy for years. Staff and parents were reminded of this policy earlier in the year.

If a CP student needs to meet a younger sib for PM carpool, they have these options:

- The younger sib can meet the CP student in the atrium at 3:30 when elem. students are dismissed and then walk to their car in the big lot.
- The younger sib can meet the CP student at the walk-up area on the blacktop. It's best for the family to choose a designated spot on the blacktop for sibs to meet, then walk to their car in the big lot.
- The CP student can stand with the younger sib at the younger sib's carpool location (front curb or field, depending on grade level). The parent will pick up both children in the carpool line.
- A CP student MAY NOT meet the younger sib at their classroom door in the Elementary wing.

We appreciate your support to provide safety for all students during carpool.

NO OUTDOOR SUPERVISION until 7:45 am

There is staff supervision starting at 7:45 am. This is TCA policy. Please dress your kids for cold weather; they are not allowed inside until 8:05 am.

UNIFORMS

View the [elementary uniform policy](#) and [JH uniform policy](#) on the CSP website. Neutral shoes are best. Students need to wear sneakers to PE. JH students wear an athletic uniform for PE. Students may wear a solid color crew neck sweatshirt, cardigan sweater or **TCA logo** hoodie in the classroom in approved TCA colors - navy, hunter green, red, or white.

PARENTS WHO HIRE TUTORS TO SCHOOL THEIR CHILDREN

CSP classroom correspondence (newsletters, emails, etc.) **may only go to the parents directly**. The parents are free to forward pertinent information to those they hire to school their children (tutors). We believe this policy will keep the parents engaged and removes CSP staff from potentially becoming the middleman whom tutors may feel free to contact. These procedures will also keep hired staff and non-family members off the newsletter distro list to assure **privacy for everyone**.

Grades, class lists, and other personal information is only shared with legal guardians.
